Dear friends and family of FELC, grace and peace to you as we enter the holy season of Lent. Every year we journey with Jesus to Calvary and witness His suffering, death, and resurrection. Jesus is the center of our lives. He is the Son of the Living God, our Savior, and truly the most pivotal figure in human history. His life is so significant that the entire world measures time by His coming: B.C. (Before Christ) and A.D. (Anno Domini—"In the year of our Lord"). Even those who do not follow Him cannot escape the imprint Jesus has left on the world.

No one else is able to save sinful, fall humans!
No one has shaped civilization more profoundly.
No one has transformed more lives.
No one has brought more hope to the human story.

The apostle Paul writes, "For in Him all things were created... and in Him all things hold together" (Colossians 1:16-17). Jesus is not merely a historical figure—He is the One through whom history itself finds meaning and through which "all things hold together". Without Jesus everything falls apart. That is why our world suffers as it does. In our world, the kingdom of darkness and sin reign because this is also, where people live without Jesus. But, Jesus isn't difficult to find.

Martin Luther once said, "If you want to know God, look to the manger and the cross." In other words, Jesus reveals the very essence of God—His compassion, His humility, His sacrificial love—by taking on human flesh and blood in order to save human flesh and blood sinners, like us!

During this season of Lent, we also remember our fellowship. We are the body of Christ and have a responsibility to encourage, uplift, and worship with each other. Together we receive Christ's body and blood because we are the body of Christ, who lives in us. Take time to greet one another. Reach out. Welcome guests. Christ is glad that you are here to worship with His family. Lent invites us to slow down, reflect, and remember that Jesus stepped into our world not as an idea or a philosophy, but as a living, breathing Savior, who came to redeem and restore.

C.S. Lewis captured this beautifully when he wrote, "Christianity, if false, is of no importance—and if true, of infinite importance." Lent reminds us that Jesus is indeed of infinite importance—and His love is for you.

The promises of scripture weaves Christ's influence into the fabric of our world: Hospitals, orphanages, and universities were birthed from His teachings. Concepts like human dignity, compassion, and equality trace their roots to His words. Countless works of art, music, literature, and architecture exist because of Him. And most importantly, millions upon millions have found forgiveness, hope, and new life in His name.

As we continue in this sacred season, may this Lent draw you closer to the One who changed history—and continues to change hearts.

How has Jesus personally shaped your story or worldview?

Which teachings of Jesus do you think have most influenced society today?

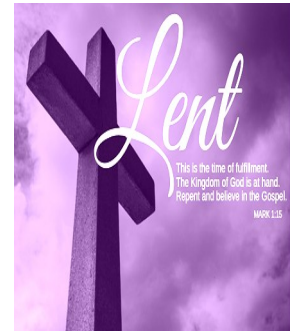
What does it mean to you that Jesus is not just a historical figure, but a living Savior?

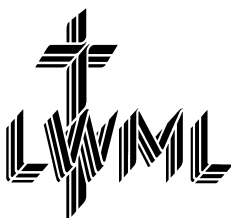

Pastor Kaldahl opened with devotions.

L. Langner called the meeting to order at 7:06 p.m.

L. Langner added to the agenda under new business: #4, disposition of the white bus; and #5, Protect My Ministry background checks.

P. Salton made a motion to approve the agenda as amended, D. Knaak seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Secretary's report – The minutes from January 2026 were reviewed. A. Christianson made a motion to approve the secretary's report. D. Kading seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Treasurer's report – Libby Stricker

After review of the treasurer's report, C. Langner made a motion to approve the treasurer's report, P. Salton seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Approve bills – no bills

IGLLS – Leonard Langner

- Present prospective enrollment for 2026-2027 school year is sitting at about 143 students. The goal is 160-165 students.
- March 26th will be the science fair, along with a pasta supper.
- Work has begun on the application for National Lutheran School accreditation. The format has changed so Principal Popp is working to accommodate that change.
- Leonard spoke about the visit to Christ the King and about some of the possibilities for the building, i.e., possible use of the kitchen to prepare meals for IGLLS, possible day care space, possible high school classrooms. There is an upcoming meeting between services at 9:15 a.m. on March 1, 2026, to gather congregational input.

New Horizons – Doug Kading advised there was no report.

Board of Elders – Paul Salton

- Call Committee – Wendy Rees will be added to Call Committee. Call Committee will meet the first week of March to examine Congregational Surveys.
- Sound System – We have a back-up for the current sound processor. Kelly Hartmann is sending some documents to an engineer at Iowa Sound and Visual who will examine them before coming for a consultation.
- Letters to Elders' Care Areas mailed Friday, February 13th. Elders bulletin board was discussed, and pictures were taken after meeting.
- The Lenten meal on March 25th and the Unity Sunday potluck on March 29th was discussed. The Elders filled out the Congregational Profile.

Board of Trustees – Jon Stricker

- The trustees have started to create a list of jobs congregation members can help with.
- Trevor has replaced all the belts on the air handlers.
- Discussion on board orientation training on 2/9/26.
- One of the refrigerators is having issues and might need to be replaced. The school might look in to getting a commercial refrigerator in the future.
- Hopefully dirt work and landscaping will be done by the school around the new addition in the spring.
- In the spring, dirt work will be done along the foundation under the stained-glass windows, seal the foundation better, and add more dirt to create more slope away from the building.

Preschool Board – Corey Langner

- We have 25 3-year-olds and 35 4-year-olds currently enrolled for preschool. Of the 4-year-olds, 17 are in the ½ day class and 18 are in the full day class.
- For next year we currently have 18 3-year-olds and 16 4-year-olds. Registration will be open to the public on Friday, Feb. 27th. Expecting some more registrations from current families before that time also.

March, 2026

- We will be having a booth at FamilyFest again this year.
- Celebration Sunday for the preschool will be March 8th. We will also celebrate Ruth's 25 years of service to the preschool.
- Ruth has announced her retirement this summer from her job with the preschool. We will be advertising and looking for a replacement for Ruth over the next few months with the hope that we can find someone before the end of the school year.
- We will be working on job descriptions for preschool employees over the next few months. Specifically, we will start with Ruth and Tammi's jobs.
- Research is being done on our endowment funds to review how the distribution of funds is conducted for the preschool endowment.

Board of Education – Amber Christianson

- Sunday School will be wrapping up on May 17th. No Sunday School on May 24th.
- Summer Sunday School will be taught by Torie Abel and Julie Chalstrom. Materials are being reviewed to find lessons that are geared more toward the younger children.
- VBS 2026 will be directed by Julie Chalstrom again. Materials have been ordered and planning has begun.
- GIFT 2026-2027 planning has begun by the Board of Education. The schedule is being reviewed, and potential directors are being discussed.
- Some Sunday School rooms need to be decluttered, with potential for some classes being moved to other rooms.

Board of Youth – submitted by Janet Iedema

- February 22 - ALL YOUTH Activity will now be ice skating (No snow for Horseshoe Bend). Meet at FELC to carpool to Lakes Area Ice Arena. Admission \$9, plus extra money for concessions. Family funds may be used for this event.
- Starting Wednesdays, February 25-March 25, LYF youth are invited to participate in choir from 7:00-7:30 during the Lenten season. LYF will move times to 7:30-8:45.
- Sign up to provide Lenten meal on Weds., March 4. Serving chili, chicken noodle soup, hot ham & cheese sandwiches, veggies & cookies
- Board will continue to ask youth to help with kitchen duty on the Sundays they usher.
- Apologetics study guide & workbooks have been ordered and will start this Weds., February 18 during LYF.
- Youth will be serving Easter breakfast Sunday, April 5. This is an annual fundraiser for our youth.

Pastoral items – Pastor has been busy with new member classes, GIFT, confirmation, and his many other responsibilities.

Board of Christian Life/Outreach – Doug Kading

- The recent Friends and Family event had 20 people attend. There will be another event on March 15 if schedules allow.
- Items will be collected for Orphan Grain Train April 12-April 26, 2026. There will be a list published so everyone knows what items are needed.
- There was some discussion about the Flagfest float. It would be nice to have the preschool float in line next to the IGLLS float. Also, it was requested to list the church's name on the float banner.
- November 8, 2026, there will be a Veterans acknowledgement between services with cake and coffee.
- Tuesday, April 21, 2026, from 2-4 p.m. there will be a Senior Fun and Fellowship time.
- The board has asked to have a fundraising chart displayed to show the progress of funds raised for a new chiller.

Old Business:

1. Board orientation review – There was a small group that attended and reviewed job descriptions. It is encouraged that board chairmen review the job descriptions with their respective boards.
2. Sound system processor – Please see the elders report for this information.

New Business:

1. Council reviewed the Congregational Profile and added a few items.
2. CTK asset distribution discussion – See IGLLS report above.
3. Delegate to circuit meeting for synodical convention – Dan Knaak has agreed to be the delegate if approved by the congregation at the informational meeting on March 1, 2026 at 9:15 a.m.
4. Gustoff's has offered \$350 for the old bus. Council approved and Trevor will deliver it.
5. IDW is recommending background checks for those working with the youth. Council agreed that this is important. IDW will help with the cost of the software needed. More information to follow.

Next meeting is scheduled for March 19, 2026 at 7:00 p.m.

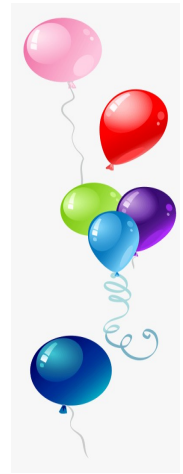
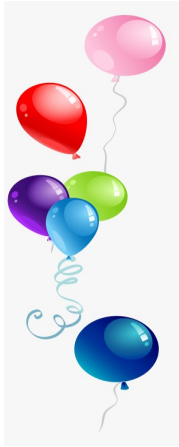
